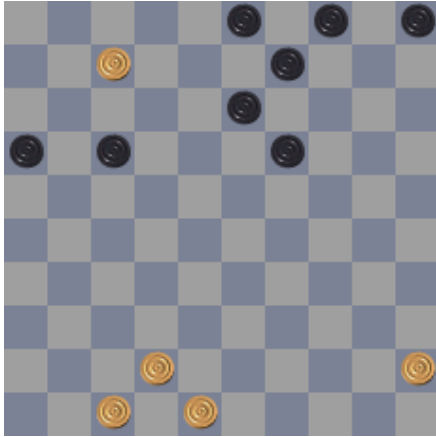


Petra Duskova - Peter van der Stap

Note:

value=-2, depth 17/22.5/41, 15.4s, 3630kN/s, pv 39-33 17-22 28x17 11x31 36x27 6-11 44-39 11-17

In this example:

- -2 is Kingsrow's assessment of the value of the position. -2 means very close to even, a very slight advantage for white.
- Depth shows the nominal search depth, the average leaf node depth, and the maximum search depth, in units of plies. One ply is a move by one side. Kingsrow searches some lines deeper than the nominal depth and others are searched to less than the nominal depth.
- 15.4s indicates the elapsed time of the search.
- 3630kN/s indicates the search speed in thousands of nodes per second.
- pv indicates the principal variation, or line of best play. Because Kingsrow uses a type of search known as MTD-f, its display of principal variation (beyond the first move) is

not always accurate or indicative of the best play, therefore you should not place too much importance on it.
